Spiritual Life

In order to meet our schools mission, vision, and core values the school and home must be in partnership. To that end, we strongly urge you to do the following:

- Each student is encouraged to read his Bible and to pray daily. Together with their families, we encourage each student to have personal devotions.
- Each family is encouraged to have family devotions. We concur heartily with the saying, "the family that prays together stays together."
- Regular attendance in church and Sunday School attendance is vital for our spiritual health and growth. Though we are a Christian school, we do not propose to take the place of Sunday School or church. Families, who do not have a church home, are warmly invited to join us at Bethany Church on Sundays for services and children's classes at 9:00 AM and 10:45 AM.

THE BELIEFS OF BETHANY SCHOOL

We believe the Bible to be the Inerrant Word of God. All truth, in every subject, is based upon what Scripture teaches. Bible is taught as a part of our Curriculum. Bible is integrated into every class to help the student see the true relationship between God and everything He has created. We believe the Bible teaches:

1. Man was created by God, in His image, in a perfect state. (Gen. 1:27)
2. Man willfully sinned and separated himself from God. (Gen. 3:6; Rom.. 3:23)
3. God, because of His love for man, sent His only Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the Cross to pay for the penalty of sin. (Rom. 5:8; I Peter 3)
4. To accept this payment for sin man must confess his sins and accept Christ into his life. (John 1:12; Rom.. 10:13)
5. When man accepts Christ into his life, the Holy Spirit indwells him and becomes his spiritual teacher.
6. God's Word is the ultimate authority for the Christian and is the ultimate truth. (II Tim. 3:16)

We also believe that the education process is God-ordained and directly given to the parents. The Christian school is simply an extension of the home and therefore it is vital for the home and school to work together.

The education process is used by the Holy Spirit to bring the student into fellowship with God, to develop a Christian mind set and to train in godly living, so that he can fulfill God's total purpose for his life. The student must develop a personal relationship with God. The student should grow spiritually, (I Cor. 2:14-16), mentally (Dan. 1:3-4; Phil 4:7-9), physically (Gen. 1:26-29; I Cor. 6:13-20), and socially (Romans 12:17-21.) The students must view all truth as God's truth, integrate, and interpret everything from a Biblical perspective. We believe Christian education equips students with skills and knowledge that culminates in practical life applications (wisdom). We strive to give an education that is spiritually, morally, and academically excellent.

II. THE MISSION & BELIEFS OF BETHANY CHURCH

Mission of Bethany Church:

Bethany Church desires to glorify God and see people transformed into passionate disciples of Jesus. Our BIG 3 pathway is CONNECT, GROW, GO!

STATEMENT OF FAITH (Section III, Bethany Church Constitution)

We recognize the authority of the Bible as the Word of God. We do not recognize the authority of creeds as issued by men as authoritative and binding, but we do offer in all humility and sincerity the following Statement of Faith.

THE BIBLE We believe in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as inspired of God and inerrant in the original writings. This means that all facts (theological, doctrinal, historical, numerical, chronological, scientific, etc.) that Scripture intends to affirm are exempt from error in whole and in part. The Scriptures are the supreme and final authority in faith and life. By this we mean that the Spirit of God has exerted supernatural influence on all writers and that guarantees the trustworthiness of their canonical writings. (II Timothy 3:16. II Peter 1:21)

GOD We believe in One God, eternally existing in Three Persons: God the Father; God the Son; and God the Holy Spirit; yet being only One God. We believe in God the Father, Creator of heaven and earth, perfect in holiness, infinite in wisdom, and measureless in power. We rejoice that He concerns Himself mercifully in the affairs of men, that He hears and answers prayer, and that He saves and keeps all who trust His Son for salvation.

JESUS CHRIST We believe in Jesus Christ the second person of the godhead, co-equal and co-eternal with God. God's only begotten Son, born of a virgin, sinless in His life: that He died for our sins, according to the Scriptures, as a substitutionary sacrifice, that all who believe in Him are justified on the grounds of His shed blood; that He not only died on the cross for our sins, but that He is now at the right hand of God the Father, acting as our High Priest and our Advocate before the Father; that He is coming again in power and great glory to set up His Millennial Kingdom upon the earth.

HOLY SPIRIT We believe in the Person of the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Godhead, co-equal and co-eternal with God, who came from the Father to convict the world of sin, of righteousness, and judgment; to regenerate, sanctify, and seal forever those who have been born again through faith in Jesus Christ.

MANKIND We believe God is the Author and Creator of all people. We believe God originally created persons, male and female, in the image of God and free from sin. We believe all people are sinners by nature and choice and are spiritually dead. We believe that God loves, values and desires a personal relationship with all people, regardless of race, color, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression. We also believe that the Holy Spirit regenerates

all those who repent of sin and trust Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. We believe God established marriage to be a lifelong covenant relationship between one man and one woman.



Marriage so defined is the only permissible context for intimate sexual expression and is the foundation for the human family. We further believe that human life is precious and should be protected from beginning, at fertilization, until death.

SALVATION We believe that each individual is born in sin, and therefore, is a sinner by nature, having nothing whereby he might justify himself before God the Father; that each individual must, therefore, accept the death of Jesus Christ on the cross as for themselves, and must ask His forgiveness for their sins; that having accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior they are spiritually born again and are thereafter children of God and members of the family of God for time and eternity.

THE CHURCH We believe that the church universal is composed of all born again believers, beginning at the day of Pentecost and continuing through the end of this present age, and that in heaven the church universal will be the bride of Christ; that the local church is composed of born again believers who have voluntarily united together for the purpose of worshiping God, ministering to the saints (fellow believers), evangelizing the world, and discipling new believers.

SCHOOL POLICIES

School Affiliation

Bethany School is fully accredited by WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) and ACSI (Association of Christian Schools International). Our school has a friendly working relationship with the Long Beach Unified School District and other private and public schools in the area. A number of our staff also hold memberships in various professional organizations and take part in regular research-based professional development courses. In addition, we work with the non-profit organization Opportunity Schools in order to provide special education resources for students with unique learning needs.

Nondiscriminatory Policy

Bethany School admits students of any race, color, national, or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national, or ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, or other school administered programs.

Admittance Procedures

Parents who wish to admit their child(ren) into Bethany School, must first have the child assessed, interview with an administrator, and then complete an enrollment packet. To be enrolled, parents must agree to the financial policies, and, by accepting admission, agree to the policies contained within this school handbook. Egregious failure to abide by school rules or policies may be considered a breach of contract and thereby result in dismissal from school. The prayer of Bethany School is to honor the Lord Jesus Christ by providing students an education based upon academic excellence and biblical values. We strive to follow biblical principles in all areas. Cooperation from the home is assumed. By enrolling their child(ren) in Bethany School, parents agree to support the school in its financial policies, parental support expectations, and the school's student behavior/discipline policies as articulated.

Parent Involvement

We welcome and urge all families to be involved in Bethany School and it is for this reason that we ask each family to become familiar with and support Bethany School's philosophies and policies. In order for the school to operate effectively, it is essential that there be a spirit of cooperation, trust and support between the school and the parents. Family members should conduct themselves with the same faith-based principles that we uphold at Bethany School. If parents/guardians conduct themselves in such a manner that causes substantial disorder and disruption to our school environment and diminishes the effectiveness of the school, that family will be advised concerning the possibility of dismissal from Bethany School.

Dismissal From Bethany School

Bethany School reserves the right to take disciplinary action, suspend, and/or dismiss any student whose conduct, progress and/or whose parents/guardians conduct is considered by Bethany School, in its sole and absolute discretion, to be unsatisfactory and/or in violation of the mission of Bethany School.

Immunizations and Physical Examinations

California law requires that each child entering school present evidence that he or she has been immunized against polio, tetanus, diphtheria, whooping cough, rubella, rubella, mumps, Hib, and hepatitis. It is required that new students present proof of tuberculin screening and/or test, and all 7th graders proof of Hepatitis B Vaccine. ***According to state law, all students entering grade 7th or above must also show proof of the Whooping Cough (Tdap) Vaccine.*** In addition, students entering kindergarten must submit proof of a complete physical check-up. Our office will notify you if your immunization or health records are not up-to-date. State law mandates that you must bring these records up-to-date within ten days of notification or your children must be excluded from school until you comply.

Medication Information

While your son/daughter is attending Bethany School, medication can only be administered if we have a current note from a doctor's office or a current prescription on file indicating that medicine needs to be given during school hours.

We cannot administer aspirin, cold medicine and/or any other "over the counter" types of medicine unless we have a specific note from a doctor indicating the specific date span and time it needs to be administered - not on an as needed basis. (An EPI pen would be administered in an emergency, but must have a current prescription/doctor's note on file)

Financial Policies

Bethany School Fees At A Glance

- \$25 assessment fee (new enrollment only)
- \$395 Non-refundable registration fee per school year; payable upon enrollment to secure your place at Bethany
- \$85 Activity Fee For field trips & activities
- \$30 Technology Fee
- 8% discount if paid in full (Cash or Check) in advance by August 1st,
- Referral discount - 1 month free tuition for one child
- Tuition is billed in 10 payments each, from August to May.
 - Tuition is divided into 10 payment periods. The first payment is due on August 1st. Subsequent payments are due on the 1st of each month, September through May.
 - Tuition is paid one month in advance. **If a student begins that month at school and withdraws, tuition will not be refunded for any portion of that month.** However, if a family has pre-paid the annual tuition in full in August for the 8% discount and then withdraws, any pre-paid portion of tuition or unused activity fees will be refunded to the sponsoring family on a prorated basis based on the next complete month, less any discounts.
- Daycare, as used, will be billed on the following month's statement.
- While registration fees are non-refundable, prorated activity fees can be refunded.
- Accounts must be kept current since Bethany School operates strictly on the basis of tuition and fees. Parents are asked to be prompt with payments.
- A late charge of **\$45** will be assessed if payment is not received by the 15th of the month (or noon the last day school is in session prior to the 15th).

Tuition Payments

1. The school year's annual tuition is divided into ten monthly payments (August to May) and remains the same regardless of holidays. **TUITION IS DUE ON THE 1st OF EACH MONTH.** A late charge of \$45 will be assessed if your payment is not received by the 15th of the month or at noon on the last day of school if that date is prior to the 15th. Prior to the beginning of each month, a tuition statement will be found in My School Worx under your students name. Payments may be made by Cash, Check, Credit/Debit card, or through the QuickBooks Online payment system.
2. **Delinquent accounts** will be reviewed by Bethany School office staff each month.
 - Families will be notified if their tuition account is 30 days delinquent.
 - Two consecutive missed tuition payments are considered grounds for dismissal from Bethany School.
 - Repeated missed tuition payments (not consecutive), are considered grounds for dismissal from Bethany School
 - All payments must be complete before final grade reports will be released to students or parents.
 - All fees must be paid in full for your child to participate in the end of year programs.

Student Referral Discount

If an already enrolled family recommends Bethany School to another family who registers their student in Bethany School, we will extend our appreciation to the referring family by giving them one month of one child's tuition free.

Withdrawal

In the event of student withdrawal, the sponsoring family shall be required to pay tuition to the end of the month in which the withdrawal occurred. Please inform the office by phone or in writing and complete the official Bethany Withdrawal Form. If a family pays the annual tuition fee in entirety and must leave prior to the end of the school year, the bookkeeper will calculate the unused portion based on the next full month and refund the difference to the family.

The following procedures should be followed:

1. Submit a written request for withdrawal using Bethany's Withdrawal Form
2. Take care of all financial obligations.
3. Leave a forwarding address and the name of the school your child will be attending.
4. Request copies of student's records and personal belongings.

Bethany School Behavior Standards

Bethany School is established upon biblical principles and standards. Our goal is to honor the Lord Jesus Christ by providing students an education based upon academic excellence and biblical principles in all areas. Cooperation from the home is expected.

“So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.... God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.” Genesis 1:27, 31.

Because we believe what God’s Word teaches in Genesis, we believe that each child has been created to be just who he or she is supposed to be. We, then, celebrate who God has created and expect students to do the same. Therefore, students must present themselves in conformity with their biological gender. In doing so, students will be expected to dress, use the restroom/changing rooms, and conduct themselves as they were created by God.

By enrolling their children in Bethany School, parents are agreeing to support the policies and guidelines set forth in the Parent-Student Handbook, including but not limited to: Bethany Church/School’s statement of faith, its mission, financial policies, code of conduct, and other policies contained within the handbook.

Failure to comply with school rules or policies may be considered a breach of contract and thereby result in dismissal from school. Bethany School reserves the right to take disciplinary action, suspend, and/or dismiss any student whose progress or conduct is considered by Bethany School, in its sole and absolute discretion, to be unsatisfactory and/or in violation of its mission and beliefs.

One of our goals at Bethany is to that our students to become responsible citizens marked by integrity and a strong work ethic. Together, we are preparing our students to demonstrate a life that is being transformed, in words and actions, by the Gospel

We have established a set of boundaries with a common language that can be used in the classroom, on the playground, and during special events that will help our students become independent, responsible, and caring members of our school community.

Bethany Staff will uphold the following rules:

Bethany Students are **Kind.**

- We are patient with each other, just as God is patient with us.
- We keep our hands, feet, and objects to ourselves.
- We use appropriate and polite language.

Bethany Students are **Safe.**

- We play by all the rules, whether in the classroom or on the playground.
- We walk to and from our classrooms in quiet and orderly manner.
- When the bell rings, we FREEZE immediately. When an adult blows the whistle, we WALK to the class line up area and wait quietly until our teacher arrives.

Bell = Freeze! Whistle = Walk!

Bethany Students are **Respectful.**

- We respect others and their property.
- We wait to be recognized before we speak in class or to an adult.

Bethany Students are **Ready.**

- We follow directions the first time.
- We do our best on all our work and complete it on time.
- We are prepared for the school day with our completed work.
- We are prepared for each lesson and listen to the teacher's instructions.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE GUIDELINES

Phone Usage

CELL PHONE USE IS NOT ALLOWED DURING SCHOOL HOURS. While your child may bring a cell phone, *it may not be used or turned on during school hours.* If your child makes or receives a call or text or if the phone rings during the school day, the phone will be taken away and a parent may retrieve it from the front office. If a parent needs to reach children during the school day, they should call the office (562)597-2814. A message will be relayed immediately to the student's teacher. If students needs to call home they can speak with a teacher to use a classroom phone. If a student needs to use their cell phone to contact a parent at the **end** of the school day, they should notify a staff member prior to making that call. Phones that are used to make calls or texts or that ring during the course of the school day will be taken away and may be retrieved by a parent in the front office.

School Property

Students should respect all school property and the property of others. If a child willingly damages school property, textbooks, iPads, computers, etc. or the property of others, disciplinary action will occur and parents will be held financially responsible.

This is OUR school Let's take care of it!

Care of Personal Property

In general, students should refrain from bringing personal items to school. Students should label all clothing and personal property with their names. Rainy-day garments and lunch boxes should have permanent labels. Students or parents may check the "Lost & Found" in the daycare room in the event that an item is lost. If a child rides a bicycle to school, it must have a lock and be parked in the bicycle rack. Students must wear a helmet if riding their bicycle. *While students may choose to ride to school, bicycles, skateboards, scooters may not be ridden on school or church property, including during evening family events - the only exception is Bike Day during summer school.*

Items Not Permitted At School

No drugs, toys, games, squirt guns, toy or look-a-like weapons, trading cards, video games, electronic or electrical games are to be brought to school.

Technology Use by Students

Bethany School is a Digital Citizenship certified school. Students and staff are trained in safe methods for using the internet. As we continue to integrate technology within our classrooms, it is important that students know what is expected of them when it comes to using technology. Students will be taught and required to sign and abide by acceptable usage expectations for all computers, Chromebooks, and iPads on campus. Families will be held financially responsible for any misuse of school computers that leads to damage.

In keeping with the school's responsibility to provide a safe learning environment for all students, inappropriate use of technology in any form will not be tolerated at Bethany School. Students engaged in any such activities that relate to and/or negatively impact Bethany School, whether on or off campus, are subject to state laws and school discipline. Creating, sending, sharing, or possessing, pictures, text messages, or e-mails that contain sexual or harassing messages and/or images is a violation of this policy that will result in school discipline, up to and including expulsion, and in the notification of local law enforcement. Students are required to immediately report any such activities to a teacher or school administrator.

Conduct En-route to School

Students are to remain on campus during school hours unless leaving with a parent/guardian. Older students, with written permission from parents, may choose to walk to/from school on their own. However, students traveling to and from school must conduct themselves in an orderly, Christian manner. Students are expected to obey all crossing guards and law enforcement officers at all times. Respect for private property should be demonstrated.

Never allow a stranger to pick you up or touch you or your clothes

Never take candy, money or presents from a stranger.

Never leave the playground or school with any stranger.

DISCIPLINARY INFRACTIONS

Bethany Students are expected to refrain from behavior that is contrary to our school's policies, in school, on school trips, or any other time they are representing Bethany School. The following list outlines the behaviors that are deemed inappropriate and will result in some form of disciplinary action.

- Defiance to school personnel
- Disruption to school activities
- Adherence to dress code policy
- Excessive tardies and/or absenteeism
- Disrespect toward students and staff
- Leaving school grounds without permission
- Racism or any other forms discrimination
- Obscenity in any form
- Lying, cheating, or plagiarism
- Stealing, littering, vandalism, and/or use of incendiary material
- Gossip, fighting, threatening, or bullying
- Use/possession of illegal/controlled substances, including alcohol, drugs, tobacco, etc.
- Use/possession of fireworks, firearms, or weapons (authentic, look-alike and/or representations of)
- Inappropriate use of technology, including hacking, sexting, cyberbullying, cyber-pornography, (on or off campus, via phones, computers, or through texts, social media, or online gaming, etc.)
- Any inappropriate sexual behaviors, including but not limited to, public displays of affection, dirty jokes, inappropriate sexual conversations, possession of pornography, sexual harassment, homosexual behavior, or any other behavior of an intimate sexual nature beyond marriage between one woman and one man.

Disciplinary Action and Consequences

The goal in any disciplinary action is always correction and restoration. Bethany School expects that parents would partner with teachers and administrators to guide their children toward correct behavior and relationships. **However, parents should not take matters into their own hands to correct, confront, or discipline other students at school. Matters concerning other students should be directed to teachers and/or administrators to handle appropriately.**

School rules and classroom expectations will be taught and practiced throughout the grade levels. Each teacher will go over class procedures and general school rules during the first week of school. Students who neglect to abide by the rules/procedures will have the opportunity to correct the problem, but continued failure to follow school guidelines will result in consequences.

We have outlined our tiered system of disciplinary actions in the charts below. Each disciplinary action calls for prayer and a complete investigation of action - student's verbal and written statement(s) accounting for his/her actions, an incident report from the supervising staff member(s) and a written/verbal statement from the other students that were involved. We will contact parents of the involved student(s) in the most expedient manner.

School Uniform Bottoms can be purchased anywhere school uniforms are sold and...

- May include pants, shorts, skorts, or jumpers
- Must be navy blue or khaki/tan colored
- Must be of a uniform type material
- May not be denim, spandex, biking shorts, workout/PE shorts
- May not be Leggings or Jeggings in place of a uniform pant, short, or skirt.
- May not be faded, torn, or have holes
- Must be clean and fit correctly
 - i. **Uniform shorts are to be mid-thigh length.** (When your hands are at your sides, fingers must touch shorts).
 - ii. **The length of skirts must be no shorter than 3" above the knee.** (Shorts should be worn under dresses and skirts for modest outdoor play.)

Outerwear (Updated Policy) Sweatshirts, Fleece, and Sweaters with Bethany logo (Navy Blue, Tan/White, Black, or Medium Gray only). Bethany sweaters, fleece, and sweatshirts will also be available for purchase at <http://www.globalschoolwear.com/> . Zip up hoodies that cover the face are not allowed.

Inclement weather Jackets should not have logos or slogans. Bethany Polos must be worn under outer garments.

Shoes Closed-toed & closed-heeled shoes are required for all students; no sandals or high heels.

Hair must be trimmed, combed, and out of the eyes. Hair color variations -(i.e. blue, pink, etc.) or faddish haircuts (i.e. shaved designs, Mohawks, etc.) are not acceptable. For safety reasons please do not add **hair accessions** that could cause harm to self or others.

Makeup is not allowed in Kindergarten - 5th grades. In middle school, makeup must be modest. Earrings should be smaller in size for safety reasons. Girls are not allowed to wear dangling or large earrings. No earrings are allowed for boys.

Spirit Days will occur each Thursday and on special days throughout the year. On Thursdays, students may wear any Bethany T-shirt (Fit-a-thon, Bulldog, Summer School, etc.) with regular uniform bottoms. However, on special holiday spirit days, students should follow the spirit day guidelines, as well as the above general guidelines for school dress.

While the Bible does not specifically state what kind of clothes Christians should wear, we should apply I Timothy 4:12 to how we dress, look, act and live. *"Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity, show yourself an example of those who believe."* In light of this scripture and in addition to the above uniform policy, the overall guidelines for dress require that all students must be neat, clean, and modest, with girls dressed in a way that is feminine and boys in a way that is masculine. **Students not in uniform will be required to have parents bring a proper change of clothing and may be subject to further disciplinary actions.**

Absences

We strongly encourage your child(ren) to be in school on time and daily to maximize his/her learning potential and opportunities. In general, your child will learn best at school. We observe the laws and regulations of the State of California and local educational authorities regarding attendance. According to the State of California Truancy laws. If your child has 3 or more unexcused absences, and/or 3 unexcused tardies, and/or 3 absences exceeding 30 minutes, a student is defined as truant.

Excused absences are due to pupil's illness, death in the immediate family, or for medical, dental or other professional health appointments. There is no penalty for this and the student will be given as many days to make up the work as he was absent without any reduction in grade.

If your student has been absent from school for any reason, they **MUST** be readmitted through the front office with a note from the parent indicating the number of days and reason for absence or with a parent. Upon remittance, they will be issued a return to class slip from the office

If a student has had a fever, he/she may not return to school until the fever has been eliminated for 24 hours. If he/she has had an isolated or quarantined communicable disease, he must obtain a school entrance permit from the family physician before he/she is permitted to return to school.

Preplanned absences that do not fall under the list of excused absences are considered unexcused absences and must be approved by the administration and each child's teacher as far in advance as possible. It is advisable for the student to complete as much work as possible before the absence.

any work submitted for grades after their return, will be at the discretion of the teacher.

Please try to schedule appointments for after school hours or after 2 P.M. on Thursdays. Students with unexcused absences will be ineligible to make up their missed assignments. Unexcused absences include suspensions, truancy, or any absence without a note from home. Unexcused absences may be detrimental to students' grades.

Bethany School considers absences of 40 days or more during the year to significantly impact a student's progress in that grade and may cause a student to be retained at his/her grade level.

Tardiness

Students who arrive late to school not only disrupt the class already in session, but also miss out on school activities and work that happens at the beginning of the day. Students should be at school in time to line up at their respective places when the bell rings at 8:25 A.M.

After 8:30AM (second bell), late students will be issued a late slip from the entrance (drop off/pick up) gate until 8:45AM. If you are later than 8:45AM, please bring your student to the front office, where they will be issued a late slip and the student will walk to their classroom. Students who are repeatedly tardy will be referred to the administrator. Chronic tardiness may affect academic grades and conduct grades. ***Students with chronic tardiness (9 or more) will not be eligible for Perfect Attendance awards.***

Leaving Campus

Upon arrival on school campus, cannot leave the school grounds without permission. No student is permitted to go to local food stands or stores while under school supervision. School supervision on campus ends when students leave the campus for the day.

Visiting Campus (Parents and Guardians)

Our partnership with parents is one of our most important tenants. We encourage your active participation in appropriate school wide events and in our open school events such as chapel and daily openings. We also strongly encourage parents to be actively involved in our PTF - Parent Teacher Fellowship and our parent volunteer program - Very Important Parents (VIPs). We always encourage parents' involvement in their child's academic progress using our parent portal - My School Worx and through scheduled conferences with teacher(s).

Campus Security

To continue maintaining a safe campus and to protect our valuable instructional time, we are asking for your support with the following:

1. Bethany is considered a **closed campus**. All visitors are required to have a guest pass, so please come to our office to sign in. No one is permitted on campus without office approval. Penal Code #626.7
2. Classroom visitations should be made with at least a 24-hour notice through the teacher via email. Parents must sign in and out through the front office, and receive a visitor's pass.
3. For special parent event days, we will have guest sign in sheets and passes at various spots on campus.
4. Parents and students should use the school office or the entrance (drop off/pick up) gate for all entry and exits at school. For the safety of our campus, please **do not use** the church sanctuary or offices for school entry or exits.
5. The primary responsibility of our school is to educate students. Uninterrupted instruction time is very important to maintain the high educational standards we have for our students. The teacher's responsibilities are to their students. They cannot talk to parents during their instructional time. While we encourage parents to attend the morning line up and opening, we ask that parents respect and participate in the same manner as our staff

and students. Parents should not follow their students to the classroom and should exit from the entrance (drop off/pick up) gate. Teacher will be unable to “conference” with parents during this time. Advance appointments for parent conferences are *necessary*.

DAYCARE PROGRAM

As a service to our working families, we provide extended daycare before and after school. This service is provided for a fee of \$6.00 per hour, billed in ½-hour increments for any portion of the ½ hour used. Daily daycare hours are as follows:

Before School

6:30-8:00 A.M. Daycare charges apply. Parents need to walk their children to the daycare building, located on the west end of the playground. It is important that parents sign their children in; children who enter daycare but have not been signed in by a parent will be charged for the entire morning.

8:00-8:25 A.M. This is a time of supervised free play on the playground and there are no daycare charges during the ½ hour before school. Parents may park in the parking lot and walk children onto the playground, or they may drive through the circular drive by the gate and let children out there. We ask parents to not leave their cars parked in the circular drive-through area to enable a constant flow of cars.

After School Daycare

2:55-3:30 P.M. (K-5) - This is a time of supervised free play on the playground and there are no daycare charges during this time. Parents can pick up children from their classrooms at 2:55 or from the playground during this time.

3:30 - 4:00 P.M. (6-8) - Middle School students will have 30 minutes before the day charges apply at 4:00 pm.

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday: 3:30-6:00 P.M. (for K-5) and 4:00 - 6:00 P.M. (for 6-8) day care charges will apply.

Thursdays during PLC meetings for teachers, students will be excused to after school supervision at 2:00 P.M. Day care charges will begin at 3:30 P.M. for all students K-8.

Students will be involved in different group activities (outside game, homework club, crafts/games) that rotate every 25 minutes from 3:30 – 4:45 P.M. Around 4:45 P.M., students will move back inside to the daycare building to play board games, watch videos, color, and read. Parents will need to sign their child out of daycare any time after 3:30 P.M. Please note that the daycare ends at 6:00 P.M. so please be prompt in picking up children. Parents who arrive after 6:00 P.M. will be charged \$15 for any portion of 15 minutes used. (For example, a parent who arrives any time between 6:01 - 6:15 P.M. will be billed \$15; a parent who arrives any time between 6:16 - 6:30 P.M. will be billed \$30.)

Parents needing to reach daycare after hours can call the school and then dial ext. # 600 after the message.

Daycare Behavior Expectations

Students in daycare need to show respect to all daycare staff and observe all safety rules going to and from school. While under school supervision, students are not permitted to leave campus. Any student going off campus during the day must be checked out through the office or daycare by the parent.

The daycare program has a variety of activities and games to occupy students before and after school. Students may not use their phones to listen to music or play video games at any time during the school day or in daycare. Students who are unable to consistently follow daycare rules will not be allowed to take part in daycare services.

LUNCHES

Bethany School believes that healthy, nutritious meals are best for brain development and growing bodies. While treats are good in moderation, on a regular basis students should enjoy snacks and lunches filled with lean proteins, complex carbohydrates, and lots of fresh fruits and vegetables.

In order to provide a variety of healthy lunch options for our students who purchase lunches, Bethany School contracts our lunch services to a company called ChoiceLunch. Parents can create an online account with ChoiceLunch and then parents/students can choose from a variety of hot/cold entrees. Full nutritional statements and allergen alerts are available per entrée on the website. All orders must be made by 9:00 AM the day before. Lunches will be charged directly to parents' accounts. However, students may purchase ice cream or frozen yogurt at the lunch window. Students must eat in designated areas. Eating areas and conduct will be discussed with your child during the first day of school. Students are not permitted to go off campus for lunch unless signed out by a parent. The Choice Lunch website is <http://www.choicelunch.com/> and create an account under Bethany School, Long Beach. Also, be on the lookout for our occasional Friday BBQ Hot Dog Lunch, which help raise money for our Fit-a-thon or other student activities. Students can pre-order the hot dog lunches through the office.

Food, Drink and Gum Rules

As a general rule, food, drinks (with the exception of a water bottle), and gum are not allowed in the classroom. . ***Gum is not allowed*** on the school campus at all.

Snacks Sale & Student Store

Bethany School hosts Snack Sales on Wednesday after school from 3:00 – 3:40 PM. Students can purchase fresh popcorn or ice cream for \$1. In addition, PTF parent volunteers run our Student Store, where students can purchase school supplies, other fun items and gifts on most Tuesdays and Thursdays. Homework Policy

Homework at Bethany School is not assigned for the sake of assigning “homework”, but rather to reinforce classroom learning, based on teachers’ clear goals/objectives. When a child does not complete a homework assignment, the teacher may inform the student and parents to encourage that the assignment be completed. Repeated failure to complete reasonable homework assignments will affect the child’s grade, will be documented, and the principal will be informed. A parent/teacher conference will be required if a student has recurring failure in completing homework.

The following are homework guidelines:

Kindergarten	20-30 minutes review
1st Grade	30 minutes per night
2nd Grade	30-60 minutes per night
3rd Grade	1 hour per night
4th Grade	1 hour per night
5th Grade	1 hour per night
6th Grade	1-1/2 hours per night
7th Grade	1-1/2 hours per night
8th Grade	1-1/2 hours per night

In addition to homework, all students should be reading 20-30 minutes most nights in grades K-2 and 30-45 minutes in grades 3-8. This is a vital part of the learning process. There will occasionally be special projects that may require additional time at home. It is the parents’ responsibility to provide a place for children to work quietly, without distraction and to help them as needed.

Special Academic Awards for 3rd - 8th Grades

- Principal's List*** - Students who receive all A's and maintain a 4.0 average in academic subjects.
- Honor Roll*** - Students who receive a (3.5) average in all academic subjects.
- Perfect Attendance – No full day absences for the entire school year.*** Students with chronic tardies (9 or more) will not be eligible for Perfect Attendance awards.

Student Progress Monitoring

Communication between teachers and parents is vital and we will facilitate this communication about student progress in a variety of ways.

- Official Report Cards will be given to parents two times each year at the close of each semester. The first reporting period will include a mandatory parent-teacher conference. Other conference times can be arranged with the teacher as necessary.
- Parent-Teacher Conferences are held in October. Students will be dismissed to allow teachers to meet with parents. Information and schedule requests will be sent to all families prior to these conferences. Please plan accordingly. Your attendance is vital in setting goals for your child, and your attendance is required.
- Our web-based grading program, My School Worx, is a convenient way for parents to keep track of student work on a weekly basis. Parents will be given a password which they can use to log-in to their child's grade records and to monitor student progress. It is expected that parents will take advantage of this progress-monitoring system. Parents can then communicate directly with teachers regarding student progress as it is tracked online.

Books and Supplies

The school will furnish textbooks, workbooks and reference materials. Textbooks are the property of Bethany School. If textbooks are lost or damaged, students are responsible for the replacement cost. Please note that lost textbooks will be fined to accounts.

All practice paper, construction paper, etc. will also be furnished. In July, your child's supply list for the year will be put up on the school website (www.bethany-school.org) . The students can bring these items the first day of school.

Wish List Items

At the beginning of each school year, the teachers will send home a list of items that will enhance the school program in their classroom. Any item donated will benefit the students for years to come. These items will become part of Bethany School.

Physical Education

Physical Education is an important subject and students are expected to participate. All grades will have a directed physical education program. If there is some reason a child cannot participate, a written note must be given to the teacher. If a child is to miss more than three days of class, a written excuse from a doctor must be submitted to the school.

Chapel

The school has a regular worship service for all grades each Friday at 8:45 A.M. Students are taught to have an attitude of praise and worship through the singing of spiritual songs and the reading of the Scriptures. In addition, we will take a weekly offering in support of Bethany missions' projects as a way to teach the practice of generosity to our students. Our weekly chapel speaker will regularly share the message of the Gospel through skits, games, and stories, in which

students will be involved. All students are required to attend chapel and we welcome parents to join us, as well.

Library

The school library is available for students' use. Students desiring to check out books must do so through the librarian. Correct procedures must be followed in checking out books. Overdue book fines are twenty-five cents per day. Any book over 30 days past due is considered lost and will be billed to the student at the replacement cost plus overdue fines. These are non-refundable charges.

Music

Scripture teaches that music is a basic ingredient of a worship service. Therefore, music is an important part of our classroom program. In addition to informal music in our classrooms and group singing in chapel, we offer the following programs to develop special musical talents:

- **K-2nd Vocal Music** – Students in the primary grades will be introduced to music skills, and have the opportunity to perform throughout the year.
- **3rd – 5th Introduction to Instrumental Music** – Students in the intermediate grades will be introduced to music reading skills, instrumental instruction, and even have the opportunity to perform throughout the year. (Additional fees may apply.)
- **6th – 8th Worship Team** - Students in the middle school will have the opportunity to take part in the Worship Vocal Team and be part of Chapel leadership. Students must commit to weekly rehearsals and on Fridays, 8:15 AM sound check.
- **All School Christmas Program** - Students of all ages will be expected to participate in the All School Christmas Program. In addition to learning choral music, students will also benefit from being involved in choreography, sign language, stage direction, speaking parts, and costumes. We believe that this is an important part of our school curriculum and invest the time needed for this community performance held on the final Thursday evening before Christmas vacation.

After School Clubs

In order to provide a well-rounded program, Bethany School offers a variety of after school clubs options, Science Club, Chess Club, Bible Club, and more. Clubs, which vary by year, are offered based on student interest. (Additional fees may apply.)

After School Sports

The Bethany Sports Program offers middle school students an opportunity to become positively involved in school-sponsored athletics. Middle School sports offered are based on student interest and coach availability. The philosophy of the program promotes good sportsmanship and good character; facilitates an atmosphere of respect for everyone; builds on the importance of camaraderie and teamwork; and allows all participants to develop an appreciation of the game. We also believe that sports offer an opportunity to share the love of Christ through our teamwork and positive example to others. (Additional fees may apply.)

Co-Curricular Learning

We believe that students learn best when they can experience learning first hand. Besides Structured curriculum and hands-on learning in the classroom, students will participate in extracurricular lessons that are tied to the curriculum. All classes will take 2-3 field trips per year, which connect to their studies. Besides those field trips, students in upper grades will take part in longer trips that will be the culmination of their studies each spring.

A docent comes to campus to teach students about a different art master and then parent volunteers work with the teacher to help students create an in-class art project based on that artist's work. APRIL:

- **Standardized Testing Week** **Standardized Testing Week** Students in grades 1 – 8 take part in national standardized testing

MAY:

- **PTF Variety Show and Food Trucks** Come enjoy a fun night under the stars with the rest of the Bethany family at this family dinner event, including prize basket raffles.
- **National Day of Prayer** Families can gather at the flagpole for a time of reflection and prayer.
- **Open House** This is an opportunity for families and friends to visit classrooms, talk to staff and celebrate students' work.
- **Middle School Performance Night** Middle school students will be performing as a final class project, culminating a year of study in the theater and performing arts.

JUNE

- **Awards Chapel** Students grades K-7 receive end of the year awards. 8th Grade will get their awards at graduation.
- **End of the Year Picnic** As a celebration of a great year, students are treated to a day of fun, including a yearbook sign-a-thon, BBQ lunch, treats, games, activities, and much more. Parents are invited to join in the fun by helping with the activities and lunch.
- **Graduation** Join us on the final day of school as we celebrate our 8th graders as they move to high school.

STUDENT SAFETY AND COMMUNICATIONS

Emergency Procedures and Drills

We have procedures and plans in place for emergencies that might arise during the time our school and daycare is in session. We have procedures in place to coordinate with other area schools and local emergency agencies.

The following drills and procedures are in place and regularly practiced at Bethany School.

Earthquake Procedures and Drills

Since earthquakes occur in Southern California, it is essential that we continue to conduct drills for this possibility.

- At the onset of an earthquake, teachers will say "DROP" and the students are to immediately drop to the floor and get under their desks. They are to remain there until the teacher tells them to stand up.
- The teacher will then lead the students out of the building and onto our playground where they will quietly await further instructions.
- In the event of a major earthquake, our bell system may not be working so the classroom teacher, not the bell system, will implement the above procedures.
- Our earthquake preparedness program will enable us to care for our students until families are able to come to school and pick them up. If a major earthquake occurs, we will be able to care for students overnight, if necessary.

Fire Procedures and Drills

Drills are held to prevent injury and death in case of a real emergency. These drills are held periodically throughout the school year and are signaled by the continuous ringing of the fire alarm.

- Here are some general rules to remember when the fire alarm sounds
 - Stop all work immediately. Listen to the teacher's instructions.
 - Do not stop to take books or other articles of any kind.
 - Walk quickly without talking, in a line, to the assigned area.
 - Speed is less important than order and control.
 - When the all-clear signal is given, return to class in a quiet and orderly manner. Follow your teacher's instructions.

Lock-Down Procedures and Drills

General Procedure:

All persons are to remain inside unless officially informed that it is safe to go outside. This procedure is designed to protect students by keeping them in classrooms or offices while there is a threat of danger in the neighborhood (Phase I) or when there is an intruder on the campus (Phase II).

- **Phase I:** Lock-down of campus perimeters:
 - Telephones (All Call to classrooms) and radios will be used to alert teachers, daycare, and church staff.
 - Once students are in classrooms, teachers check that all classroom doors are secure/locked.
 - As soon as students are in classrooms, designated personnel will assist in securing the perimeter. All radios will be used to communicate.
 - Principal or the principal's secretary will make contact with the police and the church office.
 - The school office staff will check with and be in contact with the teachers and staff (by telephone or radios) regularly to share appropriate information and to direct teachers and staff on what to share with students.
 - Designated personnel will distribute and control any radios not in use.
 - Parents will be notified by My School Worx broadcast.
 - *The office staff will control the release of any students to parents or other person listed on the emergency card only. During an actual emergency, students will not be released until the lockdown is finished.*
 - In an actual emergency, staff members are required to stay until students are allowed to leave.
 - Teachers who NEED to contact the office for assistance or information are requested to limit calls.
 - Classroom or instructional aides will stay in the classroom.

- **Phase II:** Lock-down of classroom and halt all movement on campus (besides the above procedures)
 - Lock doors and close shades. Students and teachers will remain in classrooms.
 - No one is dismissed from class until the "all-clear" is given in each classroom. The bell system will be turned off.
 - No one may leave campus, unless directed by the police. When it is safe, students will be dismissed through the front office or other officially designated location to parents or persons indicated on the emergency card only.

Emergency Closure

In the event of a citywide emergency, which requires closure of the Long Beach District schools, Bethany Elementary will close as well. Be alert to media broadcasts carrying such information.

School Communications

Communication between school and home is an important part of the educational process. Bethany School will utilize a variety of communication formats - My School Worx, email, newsletters, our website, text alerts, and social media. *However, our primary and quickest form of communication will be through My School Worx. If you do not receive an email from school within the first week, we may not have your correct email address.* If this is the case, please send an email to info@bethany-school.org that includes your child's name & grade, parent's name and email address so that we can add you to our email list.

Medical Treatment Consent and Liability Release Form for Minors
