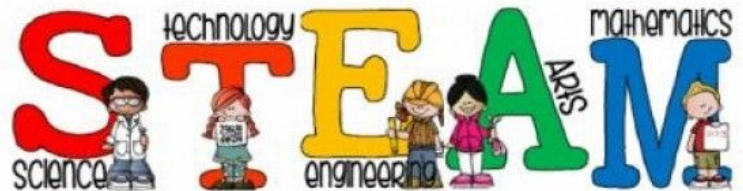
A STEAM based Summer Program

2018 Bethany Summer Program Tuition, Fees, & Policies

Registration/Activity Fee The registration fee is due upon enrollment. This reserves a space for your child in our summer program. This fee applies to each student enrolled and is **non-refundable**. (A Multiple Child Discount will be offered this summer; the 2nd, 3rd+ child will only pay an \$90 registration fee.)

Tuition Summer Tuition charges are by the week and must be paid prior to school starting that week. However, for a limited time only ***YOU can take advantage of the Early Bird discounted bundle of \$100 Registration fee + \$1375 summer tuition. This must be paid in full by MAY 4, and is non-refundable.***

Financial and Daycare Policies:

- Registration fees are non-refundable.
- Tuition for each week must be paid in full prior to the start of that week.
- Regular Summer Program hours are 8:30AM - 3:00PM* each day, with a half hour of free supervised play before and after school. *Some field trips will extend beyond the normal hours of the school day; check weekly newsletters for details*
- Daycare charges are billed at \$5.50 per hour in ½ hour increments. Morning daycare charges accrue from 7:00AM - 8:00AM and afternoon daycare from 3:30PM - 6:00PM. Parents who arrive after 6:00PM will be charged \$15 for any portion of 15 minutes used (i.e. late arrivals between 6:01PM -6:15PM will be charged \$15; a parent who arrives any time between 6:16 PM - 6:30PM will be charged \$30).
- Daycare will be charged to the family's account, to be paid by the first of the month.

Lunches & Snacks *There will be no daily hot lunch service during the summer* but students may purchase ice cream and water bottles at lunch and after school. Students will need to bring a lunch each day, including most field trips.

Field Trip Policies The cost of ALL field trips is included in tuition. However, in order to attend the field trip students:

- MUST be in attendance at school on either Monday and/or Tuesday in order to attend that Wednesday's field trip.
- MUST be present for morning orientation on the day of the field trip; students may not skip the orientation to meet the group at the field trip destination for safety and accounting reasons. Families who are late for Wednesday morning's orientation and who miss the bus will not be eligible for the field trip.
- MUST wear their blue summer school t-shirt each Wednesday.
- MUST arrive and leave from the field trip in the same manner; if a child rides the bus TO the destination, he/she must also ride the bus BACK to school.

Parents wishing to attend:

- MUST sign up and purchase tickets by Tuesday morning in order to join us for that Wednesday's field trip.
- Should be prepared to drive themselves and their child to the field trip destination.

BETHANY SCHOOL CODE OF CONDUCT

Bethany School is established upon biblical principles and standards. Our goal is to honor the Lord Jesus Christ by providing students an education based upon academic excellence and biblical principles in all areas. Cooperation from the home is expected. By enrolling their children in Bethany School, parents are agreeing to support the policies and guidelines set forth in the Parent-Student Handbook, including but not limited to: Bethany Church/School's statement of faith, its mission, financial policies, code of conduct, and other policies contained within the handbook pertaining to technology, harassment/bullying, gender identity, etc. Failure to comply with school rules or policies may be considered a breach of contract and thereby result in dismissal from school. Bethany School reserves the unconditional right to take disciplinary action, suspend, and/or dismiss any student whose progress or conduct is considered by Bethany School, in its sole and absolute discretion, to be unsatisfactory and/or in violation of its mission and beliefs.

Bethany Summer Program students will be expected to abide by the following Bethany behavior guidelines:

Kind, Safe, Respectful and Ready

- **STUDENTS WILL BE KIND:**
 - By keeping their hands, feet and other objects to themselves.
 - By not name-calling, teasing, threatening or otherwise mistreating others
 - By sharing playthings and allowing others to play
- **STUDENTS WILL BE SAFE:**
 - By following all directions given by adults & staying with the assigned group at all times
 - By using furniture, playground equipment, toys and other objects appropriately and safely
 - By staying properly seated and quiet on the bus while traveling
- **STUDENTS WILL RESPECTFUL:**
 - By listening when others are speaking and by participating when it is your turn
 - By speaking politely with other students and staff, using words that are respectful and pleasing to God. Students will not argue, talk back or speak with disrespect to anyone
 - By being respectful of others' property, personal space and feelings
- **STUDENTS WILL BE READY:**
 - By participating in class and activities so you are ready to learn and have fun
 - By arriving to school and activities on time, ready to learn and have fun
 - By cleaning up after one activity so the area is ready for the next group or activity

Bethany Students are expected to refrain from behavior that is contrary to our school's policies, both on campus or off campus, including but not limited to:

- Disrespect or obscenity in any form
- Lying, cheating, or plagiarism
- Stealing, littering or vandalism
- Gossip, fighting, threatening, or bullying
- Use/possession of illegal/controlled substances, including alcohol, drugs, tobacco, etc.
- Use/possession of fireworks, firearms, or weapons of any sort on or near campus
- Inappropriate use of technology, including hacking, sexting, cyberbullying, cyber-pornography, (on or off campus, via phones, computers, or through texts, social media, or online gaming, etc.)
- Any inappropriate sexual behaviors, including but not limited to, public displays of affection, dirty jokes, inappropriate sexual conversations, possession of pornography, sexual harassment, homosexual behavior, or any other behavior of an intimate sexual nature beyond marriage between one woman and one man.

Summer Program Guidelines and Dress Code

LUNCH - Regular lunch service is NOT provided during the summer. Students must bring a lunch each day, with the exception of Friday. Each Friday a Grill Lunch will be available for purchase (an order form will be sent home each). Snacks and drinks may be sold after school for \$1.

CLOTHES - T-shirts and shorts are appropriate for everyday wear. However, clothes must fit appropriately, not too big nor too tight. No tank tops or bare midriffs. Shirts may not have slogans, sayings or images that may be deemed offensive.

SHOES - Students must wear closed-toed shoes at school. Closed-toed water shoes are great for beach days. Flip flops and sandals are not allowed.

SUNSCREEN & HATS - Parents should apply sunscreen each morning before school and staff will help students re-apply at noon. Hats are also allowed for sun protection, however may not be worn inside the classrooms.

SWIMSUITS - Swimsuits must be modest. Girls must wear one-piece bathing suits. However, girls may choose to wear board shorts and rash guards, as well. On swim days and water days, students should bring a towel, water shoes and a change of clothes.

Because we believe what God’s Word teaches in Genesis, we believe that each child has been created to be just who he or she is supposed to be. We, then, celebrate who God has created and expect students to do the same. Therefore, students must present themselves in conformity with their biological gender. In doing so, students will be expected to dress as, use the restrooms or changing rooms as, and conduct themselves as they were created by God.

Students who demonstrated an inability to abide by the above guidelines may lose daily activity and/or field trip privileges. Continual violation of these guidelines may result in exclusion from summer camp.

Medical Treatment Consent and Liability Release Form for Minors

(As found in California Civil Code Section 25:8)

I, the undersigned parent/guardian of the following child(ren):

_____ do hereby authorize the adult sponsor of Bethany School or any responsible adult person bearing this written authorization, into whose said care the above mentioned minor child has been entrusted, to obtain proper medical care from a licensed medical or dental doctor or facility. The medical/dental care is to include, but not be limited to any x-ray examination, anesthetic, medical, or surgical diagnosis or treatment and hospital care to be rendered to said minor under the general or specific supervision and upon the advice of a licensed medical doctor or dentist. It is understood that an effort must be made to notify me (the parent or guardian) before such action will be taken. It is understood that this authorization is given in advance of any specific diagnosis, treatment or hospital care being required, but is given to provide authority and power on the part of said adult to give specific consent to any and all such diagnosis, treatment or hospital care which the aforementioned physician or dentist in the exercise of his best judgment may deem advisable. The authorization shall include transportation to receive the medical and dental care.

Financial Responsibility

In the event of injury to my child/ward, I agree that I/we and my healthcare insurer shall be financially responsible for any medical/dental treatment required by my child/ward as a result of any injury or illness suffered in the course of his/her participation in any school related activities.

Risk
